Existing arrangements

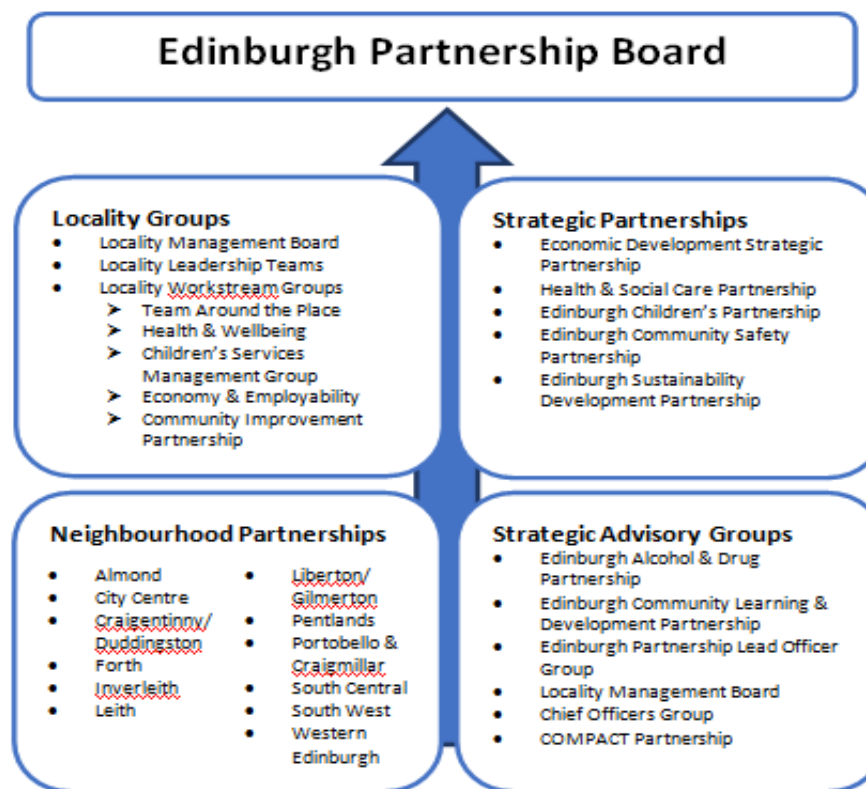
Community planning brings together public agencies, the third sector and communities to work together to plan and deliver services which make a real difference to people's lives. The Edinburgh Partnership involves these partners in overseeing this work for the city.

The Edinburgh Partnership recognises that community planning processes can be improved. In this consultation, the Edinburgh Partnership would like to hear people's views on:

- how to make the community influence more effective in decision-making processes
- how the governance arrangements can be improved to:
 - make it clear how decisions are made and by whom by improving the structures
 - make partnership working stronger
 - make the connections between the different levels of partnership working in the city better

Scottish Government legislation requires a range of public bodies to participate in community planning. The Community Empowerment (Scotland) Act 2015 sets out requirements for community planning. It also seeks to strengthen the influence of communities within this.

The current governance arrangements in Edinburgh, which form the basis of the consultation, are shown on the right.
